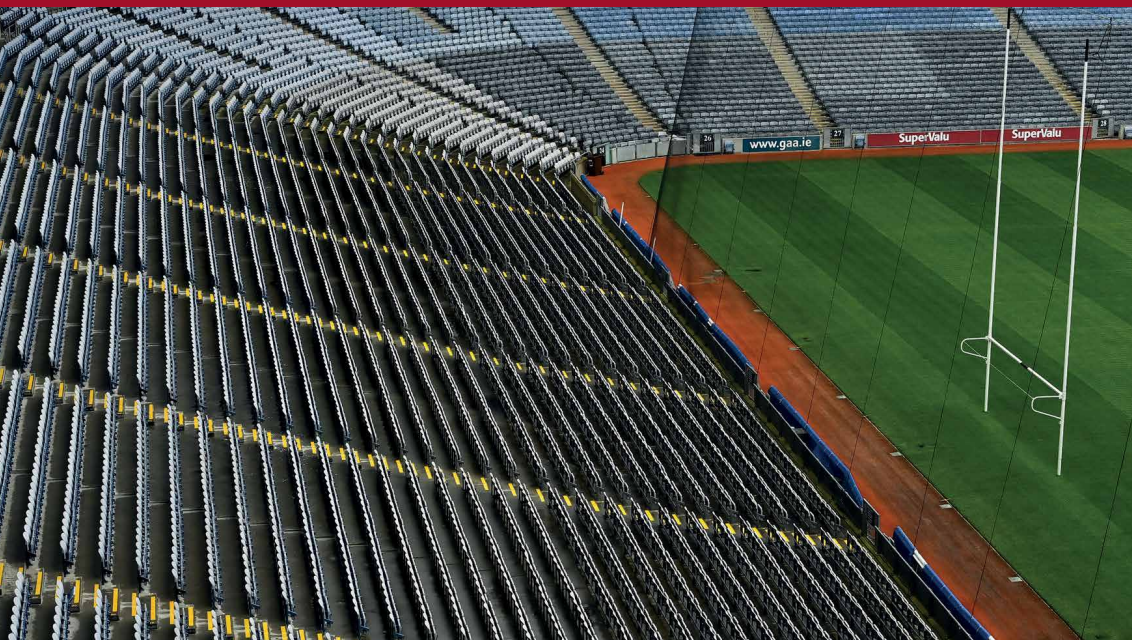
Finally Louth meet Longford in Mullingar with both of them looking to build on the performances of last year.

EXTRA TIME AND WINNER ON THE DAY REGULATIONS

Regulations approved Ard Chomhairle on the 19th January 2019 and in accordance with Rules of Specification 3.4 & 3.6 T.O. Part 2 2019, that relevant games that finish level after normal playing times should be completed as follows:

Phase 1

- Proceed to Extra time as provided for in T.O. Cuid II (two periods of ten minutes each way)

Phase 2 (Penalty Kicks/Pucks)

If still level, a "penalty competition" to decide the outcome:

- The relevant rules in T.O. Cuid II shall apply in relation to Penalty Kicks/Pucks, unless otherwise stated.
- Penalties will be taken for goals only.
- The Referee shall choose the end at which the penalty kicks/pucks will be taken. The end may be changed by the referee if it becomes unplayable during the course of the penalties.
- The Referee will ensure two goal umpires are in place at the end in which the penalty kicks/pucks are to be taken
 - Both umpires shall position themselves on the end line at opposite side of the goals facing inwards
 - If a penalty is scored, the goal umpire, will wave the green flag once the referee has signalled
 - If the penalty is saved or missed the point umpire will signal a wide once the referee has signalled
- Each team shall register five penalty takers, a goal keeper & a substitute goal keeper with the referee and indicate in which order the penalty takers will take their penalties. (A penalty taker can also be a goalkeeper or a substitute goalkeeper.)
- The Referee shall toss a coin in the presence of the two captains to see which team will have the option of going first.
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of Phase 1 (i.e. end of Extra Time), shall be allowed to be registered as a penalty taker or goalkeeper. Exception: The substitute goalkeeper can come from the team panel.
- A goalkeeper who is injured while the penalty kicks/pucks are being taken and is unable to continue as a goalkeeper may be replaced* by the substitute goalkeeper who has been nominated in advance, provided the referee is notified. If in the event the substitute goalkeeper also gets injured, one of the registered penalty takers may replace* the substitute goalkeeper, provided the referee is notified. (*Once replaced, the goalkeeper/ substitute goalkeeper cannot be reintroduced as a goalkeeper at a later stage)
- Subject to the conditions below both teams will take five penalty kicks/pucks which are taken alternately by the teams. The game is awarded to whichever team scores more of their five penalty kicks/pucks
 - If, before both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks, one team has scored more goals than the other team could score, even if they were to complete their five penalty kicks/pucks, no more penalty kicks/pucks shall be taken
 - If, after both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks and both teams have scored the same number of goals, the penalty competition will continue but in sudden death format using the same five registered players until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks/pucks.
 - In sudden death, the same sequence of penalty takers does not have to be followed as in the first round of penalty kicks/pucks.
- Each penalty kick/puck is taken by a different player. All registered players must take a penalty kick/puck before any player can take an additional penalty kick/puck.
- The referee shall signal for the penalty to be taken. The penalty kick/puck is completed when the ball stops moving, goes out of play (including over the crossbar) or a goal is scored.
- Only the players involved in the penalty taking competition, as well as the Referee, Linesmen and Umpires are permitted on the pitch. With the registered penalty takers located between the 45m & 65m lines closest to the end selected by the referee. Goalkeepers to be located 20m from the goals.
- All other players (including substitute goalkeepers), managers, officials, backroom personnel etc should be at their designated sideline area, and off the field of play when the penalty-taking competition is taking place.

Carlow and Offaly have met 10 times in the championship since 1934 with the Faithful county holding the upper hand in the majority. The largest of which came in 1934 as they ran out 15 point victors. DIFFERENT TRAJECTORIES SAME MISSION

Carlow and Offaly arrive in today's game on differing trajectories. John Maughan enters into his second year in charge of the Faithful men. Last year saw some promising performances from the Offaly side, no more so than when nearly causing an upset at this stage against Meath. They will be hoping that an extended season this year has led to the Mayo man unearthing a few new talents. Carlow on the other hand arrive on the back of appointing Nial Carew as their manager in the middle of August. The former Sligo manager is joined in the backroom team by All Ireland winner Ger Brennan. However, with circumstance outside of their control the duo have had little time with their new panel.

This lack of contact time will be of interest today, will Carlow remain tied to the system implemented by Turlough O'Brien which yielded much success but received no little criticism. If previous teams that Carew has been involved with are anything to go by Carlow will look to be slightly more expansive than before. Carew's Sligo team looked to press sides higher up the field and utilise the talent within their forward line. From this you would imagine his side will be looking to heavily build on the accuracy of inside dangerman Paul Broderick and the youthful Ross Dunphy. At the back is where things will be of interest with the loss of heavily experienced Daniel St Ledger to be accounted for.

Offaly will surely look towards their danger men in the inside forward line. Here they have an abundance of talent at their disposal whether it's the experience

of Anton O'Sullivan or Niall McNamee or the youthful Cian Farrell. They will be hoping that the supply of ball can be given to this line from their solid half back line, which has the likes of the inform Johnny Maloney in it, to give these threats an opportunity to hurt Carlow

This game may well be won and lost around the middle of the field. Carlow have moved the experienced duo of Darragh Foley and Sean Gannon out there for their remaining league clashes. Offaly however, have started a relatively inexperienced midfield of Aaron Levy and Jordan Hayes in their league fixtures. Whoever can gain foothold here may well emerge victorious on the day, as the supply lines to both forward lines are key.

LOUTH AND LONGFORD LOOK TO PUSH PROJECTS FORWARD

Louth and Longford clash for the tenth time in the Championship today, since 1970. Both counties are at similar stages of their respective 'Projects'. Both have established management teams in place and are looking for progress where possible.

Louth will have been disappointed with performances so far in 2020 having been relegated in the Allianz National League. The Wee County however, arrive here on the back of a strong outing in their last league outing against Down. Manager Wayne Kierans has been trying to rejuvenate the side with only 5 of the team that made it trip to Newry last weekend featuring in the corresponding fixture 12 months previous. Goals from 3 different sources will also be a source of positivity as the Louth side look to spread the scoring around.

Longford on the other hand arrive with 2020 silverware already in the bag, having claimed the Leinster GAA O'Byrne Cup what now seems like an age ago. The midlanders accounted for Dessie Farrell's Dublin on route to that win. However a disjointed league campaign since a return to activity is sure to give manager Pdraic Davies some worries. The stylistic match ups should be similar with neither side over committing to one style or another. The main crux of this affair and the winning and losing of the game may well be along Longford's 40 yard line.

The slashers will be hoping that an experienced half back line with the likes of Captain Daniel McElligott and Mullinalaghta's Gary Rodgers can be the launch pad for a range of attacks. On the opposite side Louth will be looking to Ciaran Keenan and Conall McKeever in particular to try and hurt their counterparts. With the winners looking ahead to a Quarter Final clash with Laois both counties will be looking to stake a claim for the progression of the respective projects.

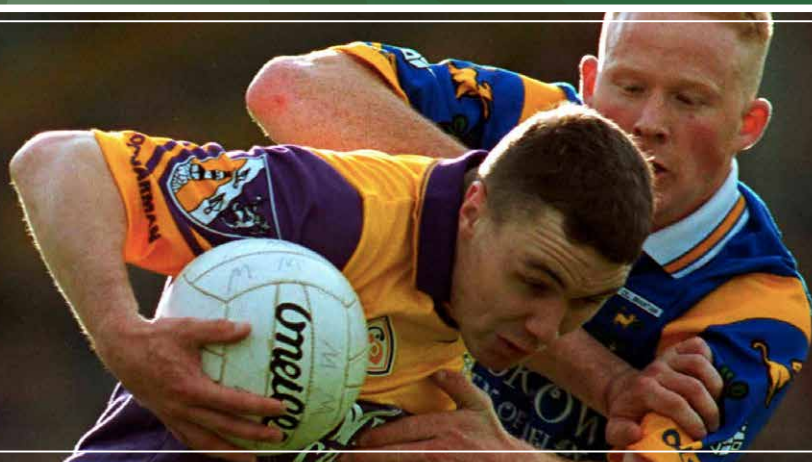
