DUBLIN END 35 YEAR WAIT IN STYLE.





In July of 2007, at a packed Parnell Park the capital side breached a gap of 30 plus years to clinch the Robbins cup. A side that was backboned by a host of future senior talent, overcame Offaly to finish off what was a fantastic fortnight for proponents of the small ball in the capital, as their Minors had achieved a similar feat just a two weeks earlier.

The Liffey siders, got off to a fantastic start as they rushed into an early lead thanks in no small part to a goal from Ross O'Carroll, to leave them 1–10 to 0–04 up heading towards the half time talk. However, things then changed drastically for the hosts. Offaly struck for two goals in the space of just a few minutes thanks to Alan Egan and the mercurial Joe Bergin.

This added to two more points left only the minimum between the sides at the break. This momentum shift continued immediately after the resumption. Derek Molloy finishing off a fine move to bag the Midlander's third goal. Watching on an Offaly victory looked inevitable, they had weathered the early storm and with the confidence of beating the reigning All Ireland Champions Kilkenny in the previous round, another win looked on the cards.

However, this Dublin side had been reading from a different script. John McCaffrey who had failed a late fitness test to start, was introduced into the fray. His calming effect around the middle started to bring his teammates into the game.

From this point they never look back. They would go on to outscore Offaly 1–06 to nothing for the remainder of the game. Peadar Carton putting the icing on the cake with a fantastic goal in injury time.

A faithful night in July would be the nucleus for a minor revolution. 35 years of waiting put to bed with the future burning bright on the horizon.

This win saw them not only bridge a drought in U21 honours, but also gave us a glimpse into what would be to come from Dublin in the years ahead. Many of those that shone on the day would go on to back bone a Senior side that would be the most successful Capital hurling team in an age. Alan McCrabbe was imperious throughout, with Joey Boland and the afore mentioned McCaffrey making their presence felt. It is not too difficult to surmise that this win and the nature with which it was achieved would fuel the future successes they earned.

GALWAY MAKE HISTORY IN LEINSTER GALWAY 1-20 OFFALY 0-8





History was made in Bord na Móna O'Connor park tonight as Galway won their first ever match in the Leinster U-21 hurling championship, but there was little else memorable about a contest that never got out of second gear, with Offaly woefully off the pace against a Galway side that will now play Kilkenny in the provincial semifinal next Wednesday.

There were some signs of life from the Faithful County early on as they created a similar amount of chances to the Tribesmen in the opening quarter, but inaccuracy cost them as Ben Conneely, Brian Duignan and Liam Langton were all guilty of spurning excellent opportunities for scores.

Galway were far more efficient, with Seán Blehane, Seán Loftus and Cianan Fahy all on target from reasonable distances out, albeit assisted by a strong breeze. In certain sectors of the field, the sides were evenly matched. Neither midfield pairing was dominant, Ben Conneely broke even with Galway senior star Brian Concannon, and the Offaly full back line didn't concede a point from play until the final ten minutes.

However the two half lines were a different story entirely. Galway were strong under their own puckout and utterly dominant under that of Offaly, and that ensured a steady flow of possession towards their forward line, which gradually began to tell on the scoreboard.

Brian Concannon and Blehane (twice) added points to make it 0–11 to 0–4 at half time, though with wind advantage to come, Offaly weren't yet at the point where they could be completely written out of contention.

Fast forward five minutes into the second half, and it was clear that the weather wasn't going to prevent the second half playing out along very similar lines to the first.

Evan Niland continued to be incredibly accurate from placed balls, Seán Loftus added another superb strike from midfield while Offaly still found it impossible to make inroads into the Galway back division. It wasn't until the 54th minute that Cathal O'Brien fired over their second point from play, and it was telling that five of their starting six forwards didn't finish the game.

Four were withdrawn by manager Aidan Hanrahan, while Oisín Kelly received his second straight red card in the space of three weeks when he pulled up for comments made to referee David Hughes after 48 minutes.

Offaly goalkeeper and captain Eoghan Cahill had been his team's best player with a couple of superb saves, but there was nothing he could do when Seán Loftus blasted in a late goal from a tight angle, wrapping up a comfortable win for the Tribesmen.

EXTRA TIME AND WINNER ON THE DAY REGULATIONS

Regulations approved Ard Chomhairle on the 19th January 2019 and in accordance with Rules of Specification 3.4 & 3.6 T.O. Part 2 2019, that relevant games that finish level after normal playing times should be completed as follows:

Phase 1

Proceed to Extra time as provided for in T.O Cuid II (two periods of ten minutes each way)

Phase 2 (Penalty Kicks/Pucks)

If still level, a "penalty competition" to decide the outcome:

- The relevant rules in T.O. Cuid II shall apply in relation to Penalty Kicks/Pucks, unless otherwise stated.
- Penalties will be taken for goals only
- The Referee shall choose the end at which the penalty kicks/pucks will be taken. The end may be changed by the
 referee if it becomes unplayable during the course of the penalties.
- The Referee will ensure two goal umpires are in place at the end in which the penalty kicks/pucks are to be taken
 - Both umpires shall position themselves on the end line at opposite side of the goals facing inwards
 - If a penalty is scored, the goal umpire, will wave the green flag once the referee has signalled
 - If the penalty is saved or missed the point umpire will signal a wide once the referee has signalled
- Each team shall register five penalty takers, a goal keeper & a substitute goal keeper with the referee and indicate in
 which order the penalty takers will take their penalties. (A penalty taker can also be a goalkeeper or a substitute goalkeeper.)
- The Referee shall toss a coin in the presence of the two captains to see which team will have the option of going first.
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of Phase 1 (i.e. end of Extra Time), shall be allowed to be registered as a
 penalty taker or goalkeeper. Exception: The substitute goalkeeper can come from the team panel.
- A goalkeeper who is injured while the penalty kicks/pucks are being taken and is unable to continue as a goalkeeper may be replaced*
 by the substitute goalkeeper who has been nominated in advance, provided the referee is notified. If in the event the substitute goalkeeper
 also gets injured, one of the registered penalty takers may replace* the substitute goalkeeper, provided the referee is notified.
 (*Once replaced, the goalkeeper/ substitute goalkeeper cannot be reintroduced as a goalkeeper at a later stage)
- Subject to the conditions below both teams will take five penalty kicks/pucks which are taken alternately by the teams. The game is awarded
 to whichever team scores more of their five penalty kicks/pucks
 - -If, before both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks, one team has scored more goals that the other team could score, even if they were to complete their five penalty kicks/pucks, no more penalty kicks/pucks shall be taken
 - -If, after both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks and both teams have scored the same number of goals, the penalty competition will continue but in sudden death format using the same five registered players until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks/pucks.
 - -In sudden death, the same sequence of penalty takers does not have to be followed as in the first round of penalty kicks/pucks.
- Each penalty kick/puck is taken by a different player. All registered players must take a penalty kick/puck before any player can take an additional penalty kick/puck.
- The referee shall signal for the penalty to be taken. The penalty kick/puck is completed when the ball stops moving, goes out of play (including over the crossbar) or a goal is scored.
- Only the players involved in the penalty taking competition, as well as the Referee, Linesmen and Umpires are permitted on the pitch.
 With the registered penalty takers located between the 45m & 65m lines closest to the end selected by the referee. Goalkeepers to be located 20m from the goals.
- All other players (including substitute goalkeepers), managers, officials, backroom personnel etc should be at their designated sideline area, and off the field of play when the penalty-taking competition is taking place.
